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Junior/Kindergarten News

RRVJA will be offering a Junior Kindergarten/Kindergarten Program for the 2013-2014 school year. Starting Junior/Kindergarten can be overwhelming for both parent and child. Nonetheless, If your child is ready he or she can experience great success at school.

How do I ... prepare for Kindergarten?

- Establish routines. Introduce an earlier bedtime several weeks before school starts.
- Practice the morning routine of dressing and eating breakfast.
- Review several times with your child how he or she will get to and from school.
- Provide your child with a healthy breakfast before school and a nutritious lunch.
- *Choose clothing for your kindergartener that is "easy on, easy off". Choose pants with elastic waistbands, not zippers and snaps, or overalls, for example, and no belts. Boots must be large enough so the child can put them on independently.

*Send an extra set of clothes in case of accidents.

- *Choose shoes with velcro rather than laces. If you must choose laces then spend quality time to teach your child how to tie his/her laces. This will help develop those fine-motor skills.

 *To prevent your child from missing out on Physical Education classes, let your child wear sneakers every day. They cannot participate in clogs, sandals, or other types of loose shoes or boots.
- Read to your child daily. Reading increases vocabulary. Read everything and everything from books to the cereal box!
- Together parents and teachers make a team. The year is about cooperation and trust. If something may be affecting your child, let the teacher know. If you have concerns, share them.
- Make sure that your child has time to play after school and on weekends. Now that your child spends more time in a structured school environment, you should allow more free time at home for play. Kindergarten homework includes *play*time!
- Promote an attitude of respect for the rights and properties of others.



The school parking lot is <u>not</u> designed to accommodate more than 12 parked cars at any one time. With an increasing enrolment, parking is likely to be a challenge. To ensure the safety of our students and pedestrians we have assigned parking as follows:

Parking Area A: Main Lot (West Side) Parents with students from Kindergarten to Grade 1

Parking Area B: Main Lot (North Side) Parents with students from Grades 2 to 4

Parking Area C: East side on (McCalman Avenue) Parents with students from Grades 5 to 8

Parking Area D: East side on (McCalman Ave behind Holy Cross Church) Parents with students from Grades 9-10. <u>Do not park in the parking lot belonging to the accounting firm of Gislason Targownik Peters</u>.

While this solution is not perfect, we ask all parents to co-operate by parking in these assigned areas. This will help to alleviate the pressure of finding a parking space as you pick-up and drop-off your child. Establishing a routine with your child as you pickup and drop-off him or her can help to keep things flowing.

Student transportation will be available for the new school year. Spaces are currently full. The school bus will pick-up and drop-off students along one route between the downtown core area and the school. The bus will also be used to transport Grades 9/10 students to and from Churchill High School for Shop Classes. It will also be used for small group field trips. Use of the bus is fee based.
